The council has voted to donate \$ 5000.00 to help with the restoration of the Grotto at Notre Dame.

We are looking for a Picture of the old KC Hall on Bridge Street

We have the old stone plaque of the St. John Baptiste Society, that was on the former Knights of Columbus Hall building on Bridge Street. (It was located where the Holiday Station Car Wash is now). The building was built for the St. John Baptiste Society in 1888. The St. John Baptiste group dissolved in 1946 and the building was sold to the Knights of Columbus. Many of the St. John Baptiste society members were also members of the Knights of Columbus. The lower half of the building was rented out to local businesses and the upstairs area was used for the Knights of Columbus. It was their council chambers and was rented out for weddings and other special occasions. The KC's had a dance every weekend for the local teens, for years.

The KC's sold the building in 1977 to Henry Anderson Motors. The reason for selling was that as the Council was getting larger it was difficult to have large events upstairs. We had to carry all the supplies up a long stairway to the second floor. This was especially hard when we had the Hunter's Stag and we had to carry all the beer up the steps. The kitchen was also very small. Bridge Street was also being totally rebuilt at the time and the council was going to have to pay a large assessment. When the building was taken down the plaque was accidentally broken. Leo Blanchard and Poncho Nadreau saved the pieces and stored them. The Council voted to restore the plaque and it will be displayed at the current KC Hall with a historical plaque to tell the history of it.

If anyone has a picture of the exterior of the old KC Hall we would like to see it and perhaps make a copy of it to use with the historical marker.
